October will be an Educational meeting – perhaps a Purina speaker or a body work person.


Barbara White says that Crystal Costa (who was badly injured training for Tevis last year) is now up and walking with a cane! Hurrah!

By A.A. Milne


In careless patches through the wood

Strike a Long Trot

by Shannon Yewell Weil


This very recently published book (www.TurtleRockPress.com) was written by a horse-crazy teenager whose early years were influenced by her association with Linda Tellington before Linda had developed her Tellington Trouch Training Method. Shannon chronicles her early years as student of Linda's and the lessons she learned.

Her respect is not only for Linda's accomplishments as a horsewomen, but also as a guiding light in how to persevere, seek goals and stay true to yourself. World famous now for her knowledge and training of horses, Linda's early years as an endurance rider sporting a Tevis Cup buckle are described in detail in Shannon's book which covers Linda's early years.

I think I liked this book because it mentioned so many riders whose names are familiar to some of us who go back a long way, some still out there and some long gone. Shannon's story of the 1976 Bicentennial Horse Race from New York to California and the splinter group that broke off to follow the Pony Express trail that included Linda, Hal Hall, Lori Stewart, Phil Gardner (founder of the AERC) and Dave Nicholson, DVM was the high point of the book for me. The old photos make this book a gem, especially the shot of the Duck as a duckling on an Icelandic pony. We all need a smile and this was it for me.

Shannon developed an allegiance to endurance riding after working with the Thoroughbred industry and makes her home in the Auburn area. She later became one of the founders of the Western States 100 Mile Endurance Run and served as a trustee of that group for thirty years.



I'm a Cal Poly-trained Farrier but I only shoe my horses so I'm always checking out better ways to protect my horses feet and legs.

My horse chipped his hoof wall and I called to ask about a glue product they have called "Adhere".

I spent about 30 minutes on the phone with the California Vettec Rep yesterday and he was extremely knowledgeable and generous with his time. He also explained how the Vettec products can be used instead of pads which will reduce nail movement in the hoof wall and provide a more secure nailing.

He also told me that if anyone wants to ride the Tevis, he will provide the product and installation free of charge and all he wants is to take before and after pictures of the hoof.
