




Jill and I started and finished the ride together in 6th and 7th place. We separated several times throughout the day and still were able to ride much of the day together. Both horses did great.


Next up is the Quicksilver Fall Classic on October 7th. If you are not riding, I hope you will be there to support the club and all the riders.




Introducing "Chuckles"

Editor's note: You can tell he's happy, because of the smile on his face. I'm glad you found a good one, Julie.






