President's Message - November 2017

Natural disasters have been dominating the news recently, fires and hurricanes. The fire in Napa Valley hit close to home. A lot of our endurance friends in the Napa area have been effected. Personally, I was involved in the Lockheed Fire in 2009 that burned 8,000 acres. We had to evacuate. Fortunately, no one's full time residence was burned in that fire. The trails, though, were trashed, and we're still dealing with the aftermath of the fire eight years later. Immediately after the fire you needed to be careful that your horse didn't step in a hole; even though the trail looked sound on top, a tree root underneath might be burned out. I remember someone, after the fire, was walking on a trail and fell through to their hip. Then years later, fire damaged trees are constantly falling, causing a lot of ongoing trail cleanup. Not to mention the tick bushes (California blue lilac) go wild after a fire in some areas. I say all this to highlight my sympathies to the Napa area equestrian community. Many Club members have had the Napa Valley fire on their minds. So, as a Club, we have been exploring the organizations that are assisting fire victims. The Board met on November 1st to discuss donating to these worthy organizations. We need to keep the fire victims (people and animals) in our thoughts and prayers. So many without homes...

The Quicksilver Ride was successful. Lots of smiles. Thanks to all the volunteers and especially Jill Newburn, Jayne Perryman, and Lori Olsen for organizing the ride.



Special Meeting Called

On November 1st the club had a meeting and voted to give \$1500 to **UC Davis Veterinary Catastrophic Need Fund.** This fund provides veterinary medical treatments at the William R. Pritchard Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital for animals that are injured in natural disasters or other accidents. In addition, it was voted that we give \$1500 to **Sonoma Horse Council – Equine Disaster Relief and Preparedness Fund Fire Relief 2017.** The Council's Equine Disaster Relief & Preparedness fund is an existing fund set-up after the Valley Fire indicated the need for such a fund. Proceeds shall be used to provide relief to local victims with equines and equine businesses and for preparedness programs going forward. Both the UC Davis Fund and SCHC are 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations so meet the requirements of Quicksilver.
